

RON'S REJOICINGS

IN THE BEGINNING GOD

Those are the incredible words with which the Book of Genesis and thus the entire Bible begins. The Bible then proceeds to assert the marvelous creative work of God. The Scripture declares that the only uncreated person or the only "charter member" of the Universe was the Triune God, the one we know as God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit.

The family of faith known as the South Main Baptist Church of Pasadena, Texas, had her moment of beginning, the creation of her institutional existence, on May 12, 1954. The ones who were prayerfully led by God to begin South Main did so as a part of a decision to remain at 224 South Main after the First Baptist Church voted to relocate to a new address on Tatar (now Pasadena Boulevard).

South Main Baptist Church had its beginning with over 500 charter members. Some of those charter members who initiated a new congregation when they chose not to relocate were still part of our fellowship when we did choose to relocate to the Beltway/Keith address during a three year process, 1989-1992. We celebrated our Fiftieth Anniversary as a body of Christ called South Main in May of 2004. The picture below shows the charter members who were present on that occasion.



South Main turned 65 years old this year. Year after year Jesus welcomes our charter members into his presence; consequently, we have only twenty charter members who are still members of our congregation today. We thank God for the vision of this group and their faithfulness to our Lord and this church over many years. We will express our gratitude to this group by honoring them on Sunday morning, October 20. That Sunday is the anniversary Sunday of our very first worship service at this Beltway location on October 18, 1992.
